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How to factory reset ipod nano 7th generation without itunes

If you are experiencing severe problems with your iPod nano, you can as a last resort, completely restore your iPod to its "Factory Settings". Before you do this, make sure that your problem cannot be fixed by simply restoring all settings of your iPod nano, without wiping out its content; also see if restarting your iPod nano doesn't fix your problem. This tutorial explains how to wipe clean your nano, by restoring back it to the state in which you received it: any content you transferred from iTunes or manually added, playlists, videos, voice memos, customization (etc.) will be completely and permanently removed from your iPod nano. First, plug in your iPod nano to your Mac or PC, and open iTunes if needed (unless you disabled iTunesHelper, iTunes should automatically open). Select your iPod nano in the left pane of iTunes' main window (under Devices). The second section of your iPod nano' Summary screen is called "Version", and includes the current software version number; notice that the second button in that box reads "Restore" - click on it, and iTunes will give you a final change to back out: "Are you sure you want to restore the iPod (the name of your iPod nano) to its factory settings? All of your media and other data will be erased." Click Cancel or hit the Escape key (Esc) to return to iTunes without resetting your iPod nano; otherwise, click on the Restore button. iTunes will wipe the content of your iPod nano, reset all of its settings to their original defaults, and restart your iPod nano. You will then be starting over with, in a sense, a brand new iPod. Hopefully restoring it to factory settings will have fixed your issue! Now you begin to format iPod touch. You know that the data may include some hard-to-find songs, private photos, or some precious video clips. You cannot see them gone with the formatting, right? Just stay relaxed. Connect your iPod touch to computer by using the lightning cable. The iPod touch device can be detected automatically. Step 2: This tool supports the backup of most data types. For now, we take the "Device Data Backup & Restore" for example. Step 3: In the new screen, the file types will be detected quickly. You need to select your file types for backup. Lastly, click "Backup". Note: You can also hit on the folder icon in the lower part to select a saving path for the backup files. In some circumstances, it is necessary to erase everything from an iPod Touch. For example, you may have purchased a used one and want to clear out the iPod's memory for your song library. If you're selling your iPod, you will want to wipe all the music, videos and personal pictures from it. Unlike a classic iPod, which requires a computer to erase its songs, the Touch's Settings app lets you conveniently remove all content without a computer and iTunes. There are several models of the iPod, including the iPod Nano, Shuffle and Touch. Each iPod has its own method of resetting the device without having to connect it to iTunes. Once you have reset the iPod, you can access the device again. However, after a reset, most of the settings get restored to the iPod's default configuration. Knowing how to reset your iPod comes in handy if it has frozen before or during your company's presentation and you need it to access audio. The Nano is really easy to reset if you forgot iPod password without iTunes being available. Connect your iPod Nano to a power source if you have one available. You can also run off the battery if needed. Just make sure it has a good charge. Press the Sleep/Wake button and the Volume Down buttons together. Continue the simultaneous hold for a good eight seconds. This will send the iPod Nano into a reset. If it does not work, you may not have held the buttons down at the exact same time. Repeat the same process one more time to reset and unlock the iPod. The Shuffle model has a process that differs from the Nano. Go ahead and slide the switch to the Off position, and wait for a full five seconds. Return the switch to the On position and hold until the green stripe appears. Your iPod Shuffle will reset to normal after running this basic power cycle. You are not required to sign in to iTunes or take any special steps. You can only add and subtract music through iTunes but the reset allows the iPod to function normally otherwise. Like most iPod models, the Touch is also really easy to use. The primary difference is the touch screen, which essentially created an iPod with a more robust set of menu options and controls. The previous models were limited to a few basic buttons and did not have a touch screen. The lack of additional buttons helped to keep the devices compact. Hold the Sleep/Wake button until the Slide to Power Off slider shows up. Swipe from left to right to turn the iPod off. If your iPod doesn't respond, continue to the next step. The touch screen can become problematic if your iPod touch has been exposed to water or any abuse. Press the Sleep/Wake and Home buttons for 10 seconds. Continue holding until you see the Apple logo. This will reset your iPod Touch. Both methods of running the power cycle are equally effective, and they take a matter of seconds to execute. On older iPods that have a scroll wheel, touch wheel or dock connector, slide the Hold switch on and off. Hold the Play/Pause and Menu buttons together for about eight seconds. Repeat this process until the iPod resets. When your iPod is disabled for some reason, this reset will usually restore performance to normal. If the reset does not work, you may require additional troubleshooting through iTunes to restore functionality. You may need to perform a password reset to access your iTunes account for this process. In most cases however, a simple reset is sufficient. Summary Resetting iPod is the common ways to deal with the frozen iPod. After resetting iPod to factory settings, you should also learn the way to restore iPod data from backup. If you have been accustomed to listening to music or taking photos through your iPod device, you'll understand the suffering when your iPod is frozen or disabled for unknown reasons. For this suffering, you could hard restart iPod, even factory reset iPod. However, another problem comes in, iPod music and photos are lost after resetting iPod. Part 1. Reset iPod/iPod Touch/iPod Nano When it comes to reset iPod, there are two explanations about the word, hard reset iPod and factory reset iPod. For selecting the correct option, you should get the knowledge of resetting iPod. If you encounter the trouble about the power, display, battery, or connectivity on your iPod, then you need to force restart iPod. In this way, your iPod data will not be erased. While, if your iPod gets stuck for unknown reasons, then you may need to factory reset iPod, and your iPod data and settings will be wiped out. Force restart iPod • For iPod, iPod (scroll wheel), iPod (Touch wheel) and iPod (dock connector) 1. Plug your iPod into a power adapter and plug adapter into an electrical outlet. 2. Slide the Hold switch the locked position and then back again. 3. Press and hold the Play/Pause and Menu buttons together until you see the Apple/iPod logo (about six to eight seconds). You might need to repeat this step. • For iPod Shuffle 1. Toggle the Hold switch on an off. 2. Move the switch on the iPod Shuffle to Off 3. Wait for about ten seconds. 4. Move the switch to one of the play positions. • For iPod with a click wheel 1. Toggle the Hold switch on an off. 2. Press and hold the Menu and Center (Select) buttons until the Apple logo appears, about six to ten seconds, you may need to repeat this step. • For iPod Nano (6th or 7th generation) 1. To reset iPod Nano (7th generation), press and hold both the Sleep/Wake button and the Home button until the screen goes dark. After a few seconds, you'll see the Apple logo and then the Home screen. 2. To reset iPod Nano (6th generation), press and hold both the Sleep/Wake button and the Volume Down button for at least eight seconds or until you see the Apple logo. You might need to repeat this step. In this way, you will not lose your data. If accidentally deleted music or photos after force restart, just restore iPod data directly, even without iTunes or iCloud backup. Factory reset iPod When you restore an iPod to factory settings, your iPod device will return to the original state that it came from the factory in. For avoiding any data loss, you need to backup your iPod to computer firstly. On your iPod, go to Settings, hit General, scroll down to find Reset and tap Erase All Content and Settings, which means you will completely restore your iPod Touch to factory settings, this is your option. It not only erases all your preferences, it also erases all music, apps, and other data. Accidents always attack you suddenly. This time, you may forget your iPod passcode, or a messages that says your device is disabled, just follow the steps below to factory reset your iPod. Two options are given to you: Factory reset iPod with iTunes (Password forgot) Restore iPod to factory setting with recovery mode (Without passcode) Factory reset iPod with iTunes Step 1 Connect your iPod to computer you synced with before. Step 2 Run iTunes, and click Restore to start to restore your iPod without passcode. When you take iTunes to restore your iPod, you may suffer from iTunes errors. Do not miss here to fix your iTunes errors. Restore iPod to factory setting with recovery mode (Without passcode) Step 1 Connect your iPod to computer and run iTunes. Step 2 Follow the above steps to force restart your iPod. Step 3 When you see the option to Restore or Update on your iTunes, just choose Restore. Then you just need to follow the on-screen notes to move on this process and wait patiently. Very easy. However, the music, photos, and more are also gone with iPod factory reset. Want to find back the data on iPod? Just restore iPod from backup in the next part. Part 2. Restore iPod data directly without backup If the resetting is unsuccessful, or you are having other trouble, such as deleting some music that you tend to keep, you can still restore iPod/iPod Touch/iPod Nano. For people who don't have iTunes or iCloud backup for iPod, the best method is to restore iPod/iPod Touch/iPod Nano without iTunes/iCloud. To achieve this, we may need iPod data recovery software. Recover iPod from iTunes/iCloud backup after factory reset Furthermore, some people would have sank into deeper trouble when they restored iPod/iPod touch/iPod nano to its original factory settings, meaning that all the data on it, your iPod songs, iPod photos are removed, and can't be tracked. Well, don't get hopeless, there is still one way you can adapt. iPod restore software doesn't possess only one function. If you are observant enough, you'll find that apart from restoring iPod/iPod nano/iPod touch directly, the tool can also recover your iPod files from iTunes and iCloud backup files. Restore iPod from iTunes Step 1 Install and run the program Choose Recover from iTunes Backup File from the left list. Restore iPod from iCloud For the steps of restoring iPod from iCloud, just keep reading. Step 1 Still run iPod Data Recovery on your computer. Click Recover from iCloud. Step 2 Sign in your iCloud account, then you should see 2 ways of scanning and recovering deleted data from iCloud. First, you can directly select the data type you want to recover, like Photos, Contacts, Notes, and more. Pick the data type you want to restore and click Start. Once the scan is done, please find the data you need and click Recover button to save the deleted files on computer. Step 3 You can also choose to recover from iCloud Backup. Then download the backup file you want. In the pop-up window, select the checkbox of data types you need and click Next. Then this software will scan iCloud backup file immediately. After complete the scan, you could click the data type to view, and tick the items that you want to restore, and finally click Recover to restore the lost files from iCloud to computer. Click the Start menu and select My Computer. Double-click the drive that contains your iPod. Click Tools menu, select Folder Options, and View tab. Click the circle next to Show hidden files and folder. Then the iPod Control folder will appear where you can view iPod files. Does restoring an iPod delete everything? Yes. If you restore your iPod, it will erase all music on your iPod. Only if you have synced the files to iTunes, you will have the chance to select to set up a new iPod or restore your data from the previous backup. How do I recover deleted messages on iPod? Download and open Aiseesoft iPod Data Recovery, and connect your iPod to computer via a USB cable. Select Recover from iOS Device mode, and click Start Scan button to scan all the deleted files on iPod. Select Messages from the left list, and choose the deleted messages you want to recover.
